Henry Ward Beecher wrote, "God asks no man whether he will accept life. That is not the choice. You must take it. The only choice is how."

O Creator God of all things, Creator God of us, thank you for this gift we call life that you have given us. You have given it to us out of love, given it to us out of a desire to be in relationship with humanity, with your children. A gift given us to use as we choose. We give thanks for the fathers that now reside with you in your kingdom, and may we honor them with our continued memories. We pray for new fathers, and those who are expecting a child, that you may give them strength, wisdom and joy in their responsibility. We pray for fathers who mourn the loss of a child, and feel that lingering pain. And we pray for fathers whose child is lost, hurting, struggling to make their way in this world – may they put their hope in the One who welcomes prodigals home. And we pray too for fathers who, for whatever reason, could not quite fill their role in a healthy and loving manner. May your blessings of forgiveness and reconciliation be present to those who need it this day. And as we remember those men we so love, may we honor them, by the way we live our own lives.

Lord, there are others we wish to lift up to you today. You have heard those on our prayer list, but there are others.
